Dear Friends,

I am writing this letter in January, during winter's icy grip – a letter you will read in March, when spring may be starting! This reminds us of God's promise to Noah about the certainty of the seasons "As long as the earth endures, seed time and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night, will never cease." Gen. 8: 22. Critics might suggest that the threat of climate change could bring possible uncertainties with the greater length and extremes to some seasons.

For the Christian, however, God the Creator has laid down the orderly, basic structure of the world. Sadly, mankind's free will to choose exploitation and thoughtless stewardship leads to the ripples of uncertainty about decay in and destruction of the natural world. In human society, we can see the same spectacle of dysfunction – discontents, inequalities, broken relationships, suffering and war besides, in the UK, the current round of strikes, dilapidation of the NHS and the pressure from the cost-of-living crisis.

What is the answer to this gloomy prospect? The season of Lent, encouraging selfexamination and improvement, might show us the causes of and remedy for these uncertainties. Are we failing to follow God's way individually and as a society? Uncertainty haunts the outlook for our own church family or even the Church of England. The promise of Easter – to celebrate Jesus' Resurrection when He overcame Sin, Evil and Death – should be welcomed and applied. After all, He did say at the Last Supper "In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." John 16: 33

New Life on the Farm

As the days start to lengthen again, Spring is on its way and it is the start of our lambing season.

The flock is moved into fields closer to home with some going into the barns where the ewes give birth. Mostly, the ewes lamb themselves with the newborn up, bleating and looking for its first feed of colostrum (which is ideal for the lamb) within minutes. However, we check regularly to ensure that none of the sheep are struggling and assist where necessary, also making sure the ewe has licked the birth sack off the lamb's nose so that it can breathe. When the ewe has enough milk and the lambs are strong and healthy, they are turned out onto fresh grass in small groups so they don't get mixed up and it is always lovely to see the lambs gambolling about the field on a sunny, Spring Day.

What's been happening at St. James and St. John Church of England Primary School...



With the days starting to lengthen, warmer weather on its way and signs of spring all around, we are coming towards the end of the Spring term. Looking back since the new year, the children have enjoyed a variety of opportunities all designed to enhance their learning and build their skills. We have been fortunate to welcome visitors into school numerous times over the last couple of months. This included a visitor from the Buckingham Canal Society, who discussed the science behind canals and re-building them with Year 2.



We also had visitors from the Milton Keynes Synagogue who discussed with both Year 4 and Year 2 the importance of Passover to Jews and the significance of the food they eat during the festival, with relevant links to RE and understanding other religious festivals.

At the Akeley site, we welcomed a variety of animals with a visit from Zoolab. The Year 1, 2 and Foundation stage children got the opportunity to look and handle various animals

including a snake, gecko, giant millipede and African snail. It was a great opportunity for the children to learn about animals and we were impressed by the insightful questions asked and the maturity the children showed. We look forward to welcoming more visitors over the rest of the academic year.

Other opportunities have included the Year 4s experiencing a day at Holdenby House and experiencing a snapshot of life in wartime 1942, linking to their history topic about World War 2. The Year 5 children have had the opportunity to take part in Level 2 of the Bikeability training scheme, developing those important cycling skills and the Year 3s have enjoyed a Stone Age day at school, focusing on different aspects of life in the Stone Age and really bringing their learning to life.

At the start of February we took part in the NSPCC's Number day, where we enjoyed a morning of mathematical activities and for a donation could come to school dressed as a number, or as a rock star or robot (to reflect the 'Times Tables Rock Stars' and 'Numbots' games the children use to practise at home). February also hailed the annual school disco, put on by the PTFA for the children. There were lots of great dance moves and a generous amount was raised for the benefit of the children and the school.

Coming up in March, we look forward to World Book Day and sharing our favourite books, both old and new, with each other (as well as some fabulous costumes too!). We also have a whole-school trip to the

Silverstone Museum on the horizon, as well as a whole-school Easter Extravaganza for the end of term.

Silverstone has opened applications for its 2023 Residents' Pass Programme. The Residents' Pass grants free access to the circuit on selected race weekends throughout the 2023 season for Dadford residents. One Resident Pass per household will be offered, which will entitle 2 adults and 4 children tickets (aged 15 or under) per event. The application form requires proof of residence (eg utility bill, council tax, driving licence) to be uploaded.

The calendar of events features over 25 race meetings, including British Superbikes (Saturday), British Touring Car Championship (Saturday) and Silverstone Festival - formerly known as The Classic (Sunday).
