FOOD FOR THOUGHT!

Jesus Heals the Blind - Two blind men followed along behind Jesus, shouting, "Son of David, have mercy on us!" They went right into the house where he was staying, and Jesus asked them, "Do you believe I can make you see?" "Yes, Lord," they told him, "we do."

Then he touched their eyes and said, "Because of your faith, it will happen." Then their eyes were opened, and they could see! Jesus sternly warned them, "Don't tell anyone about this." But instead, they went out and spread his fame all over the region. **Matthew 9:27-31**

In this passage we hear of two blind men who followed Jesus. They could not see Him, and yet they stayed close to Him as He walked along. There is something very moving in that. We might recognise ourselves in those two men. We too try to follow the Lord, but we often do so with our own blindness.

We do not always see as Jesus sees. We do not always notice the many ways He is present in our daily lives. We can miss His face in others, and even fail to see the traces of His grace at work within ourselves.

Psalm 27:13 speaks of seeing "the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living", yet how easy it is to overlook that goodness. Yes, there is darkness in our world, but there is also so much quiet goodness: the kindness of others, small acts of love, moments of light that can easily pass unnoticed.

We have had a difficult few months with drought and the trees have really suffered. One of the first indications that a tree is stressed is through the leaves, they can become yellow very early on and can even drop well before Autumn begins. The Beech trees are more susceptible to this as they are shallow rooted trees unlike Oak trees which have large tap roots and so can easily access water lower down in the soil. Most of the trees should recover and as long as when they drop their leaves, even early, they have buds ready for Spring they should survive.

In other news, the first weekend in October we celebrated our Harvest Weekend at New Inn. It is a community engagement event to celebrate the Harvest we have had across the portfolio from the many fruit trees that are growing. I also included flowers and other fruits and nuts from the portfolio such as Crab Apples, sweet chestnuts, conkers and pumpkins and a home-made bread wheatsheaf in our display. We have had an incredible harvest of fruit this year and it was lovely to share this with visitors, who could purchase a bag of apples, pear, damsons and sloes for a donation. Along the same theme we will be having fun with blessing the orchards with our annual Wassail on Sunday 25th January too, to make sure we have a good crop again next year!
